Boys State is a participatory program in which high school juniors become an operational part of local, county, and state-level government. Though Boys State was initially founded in 1935 as a response to the apparent spread of Communist teachings, today the primary focus of the program is to provide experiential education that builds civic literacy and promotes American democracy. Because each program is held independently in every state but Hawaii, there is a natural tendency to approach the week in a way that is representative of the size and spirit of each constituency. In "The Cradle of Democracy," the Massachusetts program feels a unique call to be a beacon of civic education. As such, there is a welcomed blend of conservative and progressive viewpoints which run the gambit across our nearly 400 participants. We are also the only simultaneously co-located Boys State/Girls State program, mirroring our democracy as authentically as possible. Regardless of the historical setting, over the past 85 years the American Legion has succeeded in teaching all participants that, however voluntary participation in a democratic system may be, its success begins with the citizen.

Who Are The People Of Boys State?

The American Legion produces Boys State each year, along with the assistance of dozens of volunteers - most of them former Boys State citizens. This staff oversees the curriculum, presides over debates, sport umpires, monitor elections, and maintains the daily order of the program. They are college and graduate students, public servants, soldiers, lawyers, economist, educators, engineers, and business professionals of many disciplines, all volunteering their time to give back what Boys State provided them.



As a break from the academic programming, the program offers numbers of organized athletic tournaments on most afternoons during the recreation period.

Learn By Doing

Boys State is conducted in 49 states. Boys States may vary in content and method of procedure, but each and every Boys State adheres to the basic concept of the program that of teaching government from the township to the state level and supplemental hands-on learning with classroom instruction. Citizens of Boys State are grouped into "cities" and "towns," and also assigned a political party affiliation, the platform for which they will build over the course of the week. Each city or town is provided with a basic working knowledge of municipal government and, from there, each will build a working government structure, establishing budgets and enacting local legislation. In addition to city and town assignments, political parties convene. Party delegates caucus, build a platform, and elect a slate of statewide candidates, all to the final goal of establishing a Massachusetts Boys State government. Two United States Senators are also elected as Massachusetts' representatives to Boys Nation, held in Washington D.C. each year.

Supplemented In The Classroom

In addition to their participation in municipal and state government, citizens of Boys State are provided classroom instruction in a wide variety of subjects, integrated with the other elements of the program. Major courses such as law, government and economics are off-set with more specialized mini-courses, such as American Foreign Policy and Politics and the Media. The concept is to provide Boys State citizens with college-like seminar courses as a primer for the next stage of their education.
